

Educator's Guide and Storytime Activities

Pre-reading:

Prep the class by asking the students to brainstorm places that bring them fond memories. Start broad and then slowly narrow it down to a reunion place like a home, school, park, etc. Tell the class you will be reading a story about a house that is that special place for a family, "La casa de Vicky."

Post-reading:

Group discussion: Following the reading of "La casa de Vicky," ask students what they think are some moments the children in the book will remember the most. Can they relate to any of them? Have they ever been in a house where.. etc. Alternate between quirky events/traditions and moments that bring joy during family gatherings.

Individual work: Give the students the option to color in "La casa de Vicky" and add elements that makes them happy, OR to draw their own version of "La casa" de Vicky" or any other place that brings them joy interacting with others and creating lasting memories.

Ideas for Teachers

Identifying emotions:

As the children describe memories from special places, ask them to identify which emotion that brings to them.

Finding joy in everyday activities:

Help your students practice gratitude by helping them identify joyful moments in their routines involving family dynamics and/or loved ones.







Instructions:

Use your imagination to color in "La casa de Vicky" and add elements you feel belong there. Be creative!
